# **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Healthcare needs more than just great doctors – it also needs great management professionals to keep things running efficiently. With a BS in Healthcare Management from MACU, you can step into a role that directly impacts the wellbeing of others.

MACU's cutting-edge curriculum prepares you with an understanding of the principles and application of management in the day-to-day administration of healthcare organizations, including hospitals, physicians' offices, nursing homes and other medical facilities.

In your coursework, you will learn specialized knowledge pertaining to healthcare administration, such as HR management and development, legal and regulatory issues, finance, information management, technology and operations management. Because the world of healthcare is constantly changing and improving, the course material is consistently updated to stay current with trends in healthcare management.

#### **PROGRAM OUTCOMES**

You'll graduate from MACU's BS in Healthcare Management and Ethics ready to step in healthcare management roles, where you will apply relevant knowledge ethically and effectively to positively impact any healthcare facility.

MACU's BS in Healthcare Management also prepares students to obtain two certificates that are nationally accredited by the National Association for Certifying Agencies. Those certificates are Certification in Medical Administration Assistant and Certification in Electronic Health Records.

#### **PROGRAM COSTS**

Courses in MACU's Healthcare Management program cost \$435/credit hour for lower division (University Core) classes and \$499/hour for upper division (Major) classes.



# **CAREER OUTLOOK**

Employment of medical and health services managers is projected to grow 20 percent from 2020 to 2030, much faster than the average for all occupations.

This median annual wage for medical and health services managers was \$104,280 in May 2020, which was higher than the median annual wage for all occupations of \$41,950.
